1. Executive Summary

This Decision Record seeks to secure funds from the OPCC to provide a further two years of Not In Our Community delivery for the Humber via a contract extension for Eski

2. Recommendation

To extend the current contract with Eski to continue provision.

3. Background

Historically, Eski were commissioned to develop a suite of locally produced educational resources to support delivery of lessons around Child Criminal and Sexual Exploitation. These resources were extremely well received and utilised across the Humber.

Following an open procedure commissioning exercise two years ago, Eski were successful, out of 10 bidders – in winning a contract to develop a greater range of resources under the NIOC banner.

That contract period ends on 30 June 2026. The OPCC is seeking a means to continue resource delivery until 31 March 2026.

The proposed extension would not cover the development of any new resources but would provide a further 21 months of delivery of the current resources.

4. Options

- 1) Do Nothing – Eski have developed a series of resources that schools and organisations across the Humber can use to support lesson delivery across a variety of crime and community safety issues. Without the extension of this contract, the OPCC would take over maintenance and hosting of the NIOC website and promote awareness

of the resources to schools and organisations. Whilst this provides an adequate solution, making quality resources available for educational institutions – many organisations have expressed that, in some cases, based on subject matter and teaching groups – it is beneficial to also have an option for the materials to be delivered by a third party.

- 2) Extend contract – by extending the contract, we maintain access to expert training staff from Eski who can go into educational settings to deliver NIOC (and any other) educational input.

5. Financial Implications

Budget secured in 26/27 budget and confirmed for 27/28. Total £49,000.

6. Legal Implications

Procurement Regulations

Procurement approach – extend current contract by up to 50% of current value until 31 March 2025.

The public contract concerns the supply of goods, services or works by the existing supplier which are intended as an extension to, or partial replacement of, existing goods, services or works in circumstances where —

(a) a change in supplier would result in the contracting authority receiving goods, services or works that are different from, or incompatible with, the existing goods, services or works, and

(b) the difference or incompatibility would result in disproportionate technical difficulties in operation or maintenance.

Additionally, in view of future abolition of the PCC, and uncertainty around future governance and funding provisions for this delivery for Humberside, an exercise to appoint a new contract/provider would not be timely or proportionate and would disrupt service provision for young people across the Humber.

7. Driver for Change/Contribution to Delivery of the Police and Crime Plan

- Universal offer of free access to resources for young people that reduce their risk of being affected by crime and community safety issues
- Support educational establishments and youth organisations to contribute to young people's safety

NIOC will be available, free of charge to every educational setting and youth organisation in Humberside.
