I write with reference to your request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA) made on 21st July 2026.

You asked for the following information:

7. Recorded information in which [REDACTED]

 - This information, if held, would be exempt from disclosure under the Freedom of Information Act section 40(1) – personal data of the requester.
 - This part of your request has, however, been dealt with as a Subject Access Request under Article 15 of the UK-GDPR and you will receive a response under separate cover.

As we have previously advised, the OPCC does not handle or process complaints against the PCC or DPCC, this is the responsibility of the Humberside Police and Crime Panel. Any information originating from the Police and Crime Panel is considered to be owned by them under the Freedom of Information Act.

Since the Police and Crime Panel were copied into your correspondence, we have assumed that they have your request and will respond in due course, however they have also been copied into our response to ensure the request is transferred to them, as you requested.
