### Over 200 schools signed up to our **SAFER SCHOOLS PARTNERSHIP**



### **WE FACILITATED ‘MEN AT WORK CIC’**

training for prison officers at HMP Hull and HMP Humber, supporting constructive dialogue with young adult prisoners through reframing techniques.



### In April 2025, we commissioned an **INDEPENDENT VAWG-FOCUSED VICTIMS VOICE PANEL,**

awarded to Forum CiC. The panel complements existing scrutiny work, uniting lived experience with decision-makers to drive service improvements.



### **COMMISSIONED HEALTH GOSPEL CIC**

who engaged women marginalised by faith and ethnicity, to better understand the barriers faced to reporting domestic abuse.



### Engaging football supporters to **DO THE RIGHT THING: DOMESTIC ABUSE PREVENTION CAMPAIGNS**

launched at Hull City, Grimsby Town and Scunthorpe United grounds.



### **POLICE OFFICER NUMBERS ARE THE HIGHEST FOR OVER A DECADE,**

and our Hotspot Action Fund has provided additional resources to target serious violence and ASB.

### Almost 3600 completed our **ANNUAL POLICE & CRIME PLAN SURVEY,**

our biggest response to this survey to date. We also have had almost 600 people complete our consultation on the future of Beverley Police Station.



### We coordinated **SAFER STREETS SUMMER**

plans across 16 centres, bringing police and community partners together to tackle crime and anti-social behaviour through visibility, prevention, and enforcement.



### **WE’VE INTRODUCED NEW PROJECTS IN CUSTODY SUITES,**

including a **translation system** for visitor-detainee communication and **books with positive messaging** to support those affected by domestic abuse — both those harmed and those who harm.



Our work to help **REDUCE ASB** continues with a new strategic needs assessment. Our toolkit was included in National Police Guidance and our ASB conferences continue to be well attended.

### Following a successful pilot programme in 2024/25, the **SIDS GRANT SCHEME**

has been extended and has a budget of up to **£40,000** available up until end of March 2026.

### **HU9 FINAL REPORT ON TRAUMA-INFORMED SCHOOLS PUBLISHED.**



Published report evaluating the effectiveness of the **CROSSROADS INTERVENTION** that aims to reduce harm from domestic abuse.



### We commissioned **CARA,**

which is a conditional caution for adult relationship abuse. CARA sits within the criminal justice system as an early ‘awareness raising’ diversionary service.

### As one of six national pilot sites for **RANEEM’S LAW,**

we’re enhancing domestic abuse response through our Force Control Room specialist — improving how the force supports those affected.



### We’ve invested over **£500,000**

to expand high-risk domestic abuse perpetrator services across the region including a new provision in North Lincolnshire and a 26-week Hull programme currently undergoing accreditation.



### **OUR OFFICE RECRUITED A NEW CHIEF CONSTABLE IN CHRIS TODD**



We’ve made significant **INTERNAL SYSTEM AND POLICY CHANGES,** delivering greater efficiency, cost savings, and enabling team growth to better serve our communities.



Working with local partners, we welcomed visits from the Home Office and Policing Minister - **SHOWCASING HUMBERSIDE’S INNOVATION,** best practice, and strong national interest in our collaborative work.



The 2025 **VPP PARTNERS CONFERENCE** was attended by over 200 delegates, including the then Policing Minister Dame Diana Johnson MP.



We have commissioned services to the value of **£1.3m, supporting victims of all crime** but with additional spend on victims of sexual violence, domestic abuse, and stalking, as per the evidence base and realising the aims of local and national ambitions to address VAWG.



PCC commits to **£6.8MILLION** funding of Community Safety, Youth Justice and Safeguarding Partnerships across the region over the next 4 years.
